See that you do not refuse Him who speaks. For if they did not escape who refused Him who spoke on earth, much more shall we not escape if we turn away from Him who speaks from heaven, whose voice then shook the earth; but now He has promised, saying, "Yet once more I shake not only the earth, but also heaven." Now this, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of those things that are being shaken, as of things that are made, that the things which cannot be shaken may remain. Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom which cannot be shaken, let us have grace, by which we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear. For our God is a consuming fire.

Introduction



- The writer of Hebrews urges us to hear the heavenly voice.
- ❖ He points us back to the beginning of the nation of Israel for an example to follow (12:18-24).
- We are commanded to serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear.
- This is because of the holy nature of God!
- * Too often I fear we approach the worship of God without these necessary attributes.

Heed these warnings

1 Peter 1:15-16

"but as He who called you is holy, you also be holy in all *your* conduct, because it is written, "Be holy, for I am holy."

Exodus 3:5

"Then He said, "Do not draw near this place. Take your sandals off your feet, for the place where you stand *is* holy ground."

When we come into the presence of God we are treading on holy ground!

 - Compare with Hebrews 12:26-28

Hebrews 12:26-28

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The present removal of those things that **ARE** being shaken.

That the things which CANNOT be shaken **MAY** remain.

We **ARE** receiving a kingdom which CANNOT be shaken.

Hebrews 12:18-24

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At Mount Sinai

- Verse 6 "a holy nation"
- Verse 10 "consecrate them...wash their clothes"
- Verse 12 "set bounds...DO NOT GO to the mountain"
- Verse 18 God descended in fire
- Verse 21 "warn the people"
- Verse 22 "priests... consecrate themselves"
- Verse 23 "set bounds...consecrate the mountain"
- Verse 24 only Moses and Aaron allowed on the mountain



- **Verses 2-17 Ten Commandments**
- **Verses 18-21**
- Thunder, lightning, sounds, the mountain smoked
- The people trembled and stood afar off
- They asked Moses to speak to God for them
- Moses drew near THE THICK DARKNESS WHERE GOD WAS

- Moses returns to the mountain for 40 days and 40 nights (24:12-18)
